

### Logic on Defense Answers

1. Partner has the queen. If declarer had the queen, he would play low from dummy.
2. Partner has the jack. If declarer had the jack, he would play low from dummy so he could lead low to the queen later.
3. Partner has the king. If declarer had the king, he would play low from dummy so he could finesse the 10 later.
4. (a) South has the 5. East would (should) play the 5 with 54 doubleton.  
(b) You can't tell who has the 2 as South may be concealing it or East could have the 42 doubleton.
5. East must have the jack. With the AJ(x), South would play low from dummy.
6. East must have the jack. If South had QJ(x), he would start with the queen.
7. East must have Jx. With the AJxx, South would start the suit from dummy and take a finesse.
8. Partner must have the ace. If South had the ace, he would take a finesse starting the suit from dummy.
